We have worked with the Numicon equipment this week to help us in all sorts of ways - to show number bonds, to practise doubles and to help us solve multiplication problems.

English

Year 1s have been reading and responding to the Jack Frost and other 'Snowy' stories. They have also done some music and movement based around these themes. The year 2s have worked really well with their reading assessments and have shown me their different comprehension skills.

<u>Swifts</u>

In maths Swifts have been learning about multiplication

and division. Year 3 have been dividing by 3, 4 and 5 using multiplication facts with remainders. Year 4 have been dividing numbers above the 10th multiple using chunking on a number line. They have also been solving multiplication and division word problems.

During English Swifts have been retelling the traditional tale of The Fisherman and His Wife. They have learnt about the features of traditional tales and have written a character description as the opening paragraph to their story.

Swifts thoroughly enjoyed their Tudor trip to Stranger's Hall. They had a fantastic day dressing up in Tudor clothes, handling Tudor objects, laying a Tudor table, weaving and learning all about Robert Kett's rebellion.

Please can we have 2 litre bottles and any type of bottle tops. This will be an ongoing request so please bring any items into the school office, thank you.




<u>English</u>

We have been looking at different types of formal and informal diaries, and have discusses the features we would expect to see. We have begun to write our own formal diary about an ancient Egyptian pyramid builder.

<u>Maths</u>

This week Y5 have been learning to do division by 'chunking' groups of numbers, using a number line. E.g. 174 ÷ 4 = 43 r2



Y6 have been dividing using the 'bus-stop' method, showing remainders as decimals and fractions.
