Our main value for this half term is Challenge. This also links in with Creation, Creativity and Friendship.

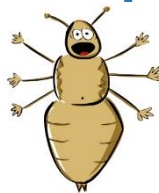


## KS2 Carol Concert

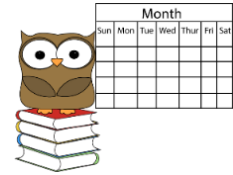
