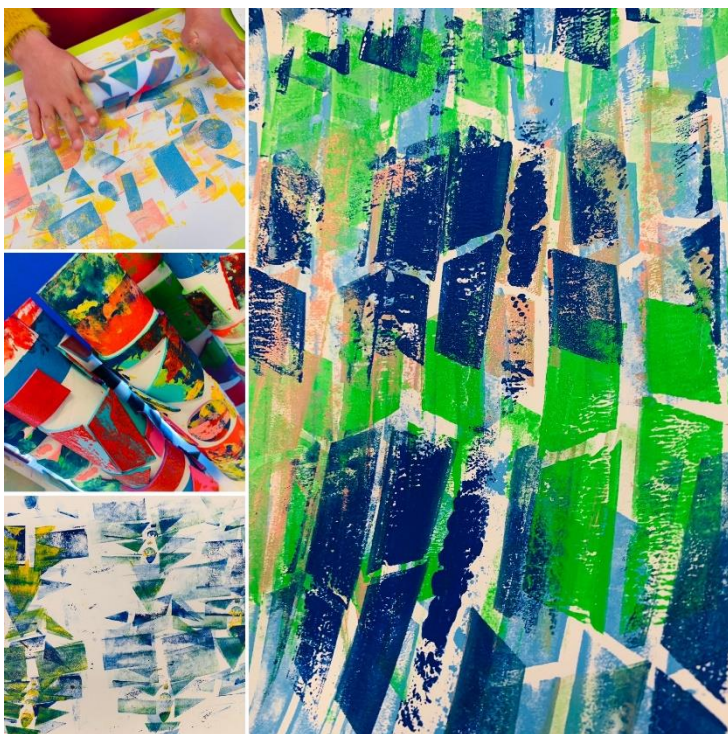


We had a really good turn out for our Litter pick at Dunwich. We even had a group of former students who came along too.

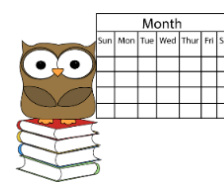
