

Behaviour

School Rules - Each class will decide on a set of class rules at the beginning of each year. By making the rules as a class the children feel a responsibility to keep to them and feel a valued member of the group. They are then reminded of the rules at the start of each term.

Rewards - Great effort, good work and kind actions all deserve to be rewarded. The school operates a 'Busy Bee' reward system. Children who have made a significant achievement during the week will be given a Bee to put on the displays in the hall. At the Sharing Assembly, the children will be then be given their Bee to keep.

Sharing Assembly- Parents and carers are invited into school each term to share the children's work, and the presentation of the Bee Certificates.

Golden Time - Sparrows, Skylarks and Willows have Golden Time once a week, children earn this privilege by working hard, and showing positive behaviour throughout the week.

Discipline - We try to keep the school rules as few and as simple as possible. Our aim is to encourage self-discipline, good manners, consideration for others and good work habits. Children are encouraged to take responsibility for their own actions. If a child's behaviour gives cause for concern, we will try to involve the parents at an early stage, as we believe it is vital for school and parents to work closely together.
