


<u> Values for Life - Creation</u>

<u>Maths</u>

This week in maths we have been working on addition and subtraction. All children have done amazingly well at learning how to do column addition and subtraction. The concept of carrying over and borrowing has been learnt and the Hexagons group has been using inverse operations to check their answers.

Literacy

In our writing we have been planning and writing character descriptions. We wrote some ideas and thoughts about our talking partner and then used these ideas to write a detailed description of them.

<u>Maths</u>

This week we have been buying items, using column addition to find the cost, and using empty number lines to find change from different amounts of money.
