Maths: We have been investigating ratio and proportion and measures of volume, as well as number bonds to 100 and 1000 on an empty number line.

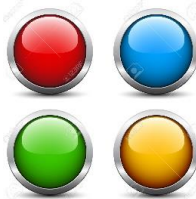
Willows
