Sparrows

These past few weeks we have been reading Goldilocks



and the Three Bears. We have looked at different types of bears in the wild, their habitats and their diets. We also made porridge and looked at how the ingredients changed as we cooked it. We all had a taste too! In literacy, the reception children have made a 'wanted' poster for Goldilocks, while the Y1s have written a porridge recipe and a sorry message from Goldilocks, as well as a 'wanted' poster.

In maths the Y1s have looked at replacing missing numbers, writing numbers to 20 and estimating using numbers to 10. The YRs were ordering numbers to 10 and counting bears to 10. The YR children have started their phonics and have so far learnt s, a, t and p.

The children have settled in absolutely brilliantly, we are so proud of them all!

We have begun a theme of Fairy Tales in English, discussing what we already know, learning about their features and acting out our own versions.

Swifts

This week in English Swifts have been enjoying a variety of Greek myths. They have worked collaboratively to retell the story of Icarus using powerful verbs. Great teamwork Swifts!

In maths Swifts have been learning about place value. They have been generating their own numbers using a selection of resources and worked hard to record these numbers using different partitioning methods.
