

Sparrows

This week Sparrows have been Aladdin as part of our traditional tales theme. We have talked about the setting of the story, its features, and how it is different to where we live. In literacy our reception children have written signs for the front of Aladdin's cave. The Y1 children have written a speech bubble for a section of the story and wrote 3 wishes that they would like granted. In maths the Y1s have measured magic carpets, compared amounts of treasure and looked at 1 more and 1 less. In phonics reception children have now learnt s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d and g.



Skylarks

During topic time we have looked at different habitats, large and small, and matched the plants and animals to where they are best suited.

During English we have done a more in depth study of Little Red Riding Hood, exploring vocabulary and sequencing parts of the story. Y1s have drawn and labelled story maps and Y2s are writing their own versions.

In maths we have begun to understand addition more fully using number bonds, and adding 1s and 10s.
