


#### Values for Life - Peace

This week Sparrows have been looking at "Jack and the Beanstalk." In maths the reception children made a castle using 2D shapes. The Y1 children made a castle using 3D shapes and discussed faces, edges and corners. They also practised counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. In literacy the Y1 children wrote a diary (as Jack), wrote a character description and wrote a letter of apology from Jack to the giant. The YR children are currently practising their blending of CVC words in phonics. Next week we will be focussing on "The Three Little Pigs."

Kid Inventors' Day was created to celebrate the achievements of the world's youngest inventors as well as encourage creativity and imagination!

To celebrate Kid Inventors' Day we are running a competition for school children to design a school lunch consisting of a main course and a dessert. The winning dish will then be prepared, cooked and served across our 230 Norfolk and Suffolk Primary Schools on Kid Inventors' Day which is **Thursday 17**<sup>th</sup> **January 2019**!

When designing your main course you will need to include:

- One portion of protein such as chicken, turkey, pork, beef, fish or quorn
- One portion of carbohydrates such as potatoes, pasta, noodles, rice or bread
  - At least two portions of vegetables or salad items
  - Consider using a sauce or gravy to make it extra tasty!

When designing your dessert consider:

- Using fruit as a flavouring or decoration
- Having a sauce, cream or custard to serve with it

Judges will be looking for creative menu ideas and inventive ways in how you draw your menu ideas.
