This week we have been working on place value up to 7 digits. We have added and subtracted and rounded numbers to the nearest 1, 10's, 100's, 1000's, 10,000's, 100,000's and 1,000,000's, and multiplied and divided whole and decimal numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.
