

In maths the Y1 children have been partitioning numbers and learning to multiply numbers. The reception children have drawn a fire engine and labelled the parts of it. In phonics the reception children have learnt z, zz, y and qu. We hope that Mrs Taylor is feeling better very soon as we miss her!

### <u>Skylarks</u>

It's been great to be back and get stuck into our spring term's work.

For maths the Y1s have been revising their number and calculation skills, and Y2s have been introduced to adding and subtracting using the empty number line technique.

In English we have been using punctuation and conjunctions (joining words) to improve our writing. We have written narratives all about ice cream, meal times and foods that we like or dislike.


