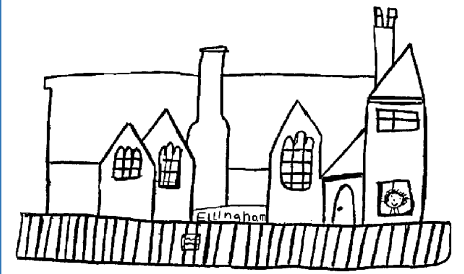

## Sparrows

This week in Sparrows our focus has been doctors and paramedics, as part of our  People Who Help Us theme. We have talked about our own experiences of needing a doctor or a paramedic and what they did to help us. We also looked at Florence Nightingale and what she did for nursing. For literacy, the Y1 children wrote a Florence Nightingale fact file, described a picture from our focus story 'Ambulance in Action' and made a story map, whilst in maths they've looked at arrays using the 2, 5 and 10 times table and then looked at doubling 2 digit numbers. Reception children wrote a speech bubble for a paramedic in literacy. In phonics, reception have learnt th, ai, ee, igh and oa this week.

During art this week Swifts embraced their artistic flair to produce some Jurassic Coast themed artwork. They painted pictures of dinosaurs and Mary Anning. They also used the medium of charcoal to draw fossils.

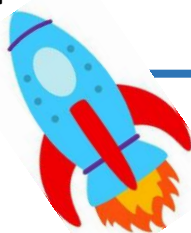
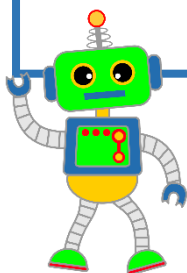


### English

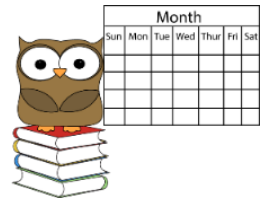
