<u>Sparrows</u>

This week in Sparrows our focus has been the dentist, as part of our People Who Help Us theme.



We have looked at how to brush our teeth and for how long. The children have learnt the names for our teeth. The Y1 children have written a leaflet about how to look after your teeth. In maths the Y1s have been weighing healthy foods using electronic and balance scales. Reception children have used the balance scales to find out which healthy foods are heavy and light.

In phonics reception children have learnt oo, ar, ow and oi.

Swifts

During English Swifts have been learning about riddle poetry. They have explored different styles of riddles and worked collaboratively to identify the features of riddles. We have also started to consider metaphors and how to identify and write them. This week in maths Swifts have learnt

about bar modelling and how to use this, together with their addition and subtraction skills, to help solve one and two step word problems.

As part of our Jurassic Coast topic work Swifts wrote about Mary Anning and learnt about types of rocks and how they are formed. We enjoyed making a Play Doh model to show the types of rocks on the Jurassic Coast and their geological timeline.

World Book Day – Thursday 7th March

This year our theme will be 'Science Fiction.' Children may come in dressed up in that theme. We will be having activities during the day which are based around World Book Day. Your child will also bring home a voucher which will entitle them to a free book from participating shops.




