This week in Sparrows We have been reading 'Aliens Love Underpants.'




We've been describing the features of 2D shapes and using positional language to describe where the aliens are hiding. We've designed our own aliens, giving them names and describing their features.

<u>Swifts</u>

During maths this week Swifts have been learning to subtract



by counting on using a number line. They have also been adding and subtracting 2/3 digit numbers and ones, tens and hundreds. In English Swifts have continued learning about the terrible Tudors! They have been history detectives to recognise the features of stories set in the past. Swifts have learnt about powerful verbs and adverbs and used these to describe a character from a Tudor themed book called 'The Prince, the Cook and the Cunning King.' Thank you for your ongoing support with Swifts weekly homework of spellings, spelling word search, Times Tables Olympics and Maths Whizz (aiming to make four progressions.) Please read with your child at least 3 times a week and record it in their reading record book. Reading books and reading records need to return to school each day.

Our work this week has all been about decimal numbers. We have added decimal numbers with different amounts of decimal places, ensuring we line up the decimal points. We have also rounded decimals to the nearest 100th, 10th and whole number. We have used number lines to subtract decimals from whole numbers.

<u>English</u>

This week we have been learning about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb. We have written notes and are using them to write a newspaper report. We have thought about all the features we need to include, such as headline, byline, formal language and eye witness reports.
