<u>Maths</u>

This week we have been working with fractions. Year 5 have been partitioning and halving numbers and finding equivalent fractions. Year 6 have been comparing adding and subtracting fractions using equivalence and by finding the common denominator. Please can you make sure you help your child to learn their times tables, as it is essential they know them in years 5 and 6.

<u>English</u>

We have continued writing our newspaper reports, thinking particularly about using eyewitness reports to give extra detail. We have thought carefully about using the correct speech punctuation, and using different verbs instead of 'said' in the reporting clause.
