This week Y5 have continued with work about angles, and have practised using a protractor. They have learnt about angles in a quadrilateral adding up to 360°, and that opposite angles on intersecting lines are equal. Y6 have been completing arithmetic and problem solving assessments. English

We have finished writing balanced arguments as to whether it is right to dig up ancient Egyptian tombs, and have written conclusions with our opinion. We have <u>also</u> written reports about mummification. As part of our project we will be making Egyptian death masks. This involves putting Mudroc (which plaster casts are made of) on to the face. #### Packed Lunches


Please can we remind parents that sweets are not allowed in packed lunches. Please provide your children with a healthy, balanced lunch.
